Director's Report	Staffing: Elissa Rowe addressed concerns about attracting and retaining O&M specialists. There is a national shortage of O&M professionals, but Maine is doing well currently. There are 11 O&M positions available, 10 are filled. While Maine isn't competitive nationally for salary, O&M specialists did a video about being in the field while living in Maine which has helped. The good news is people want to live and work in Maine. Increasing salary is challenging. The pay range is between 49K and 61K, and there is a 9-step system in place, giving O&M yearly raises with satisfactory performance reviews. DBVI has someone doing a paid O&M internship, and this individual may fill the last open position in the fall.	NONE	NONE

Directors Report	DBVI has been working on the retention of O&M Specialists. The specialists need continuing education credits to keep their certification. DBVI asked to be able to support them with the costs of their continuing education as well as the \$500 yearly payment to renew their certification. There are 6 VRC ⁴ positions with DBVI in total. 2 are vacant, and 2 are new hires. The two vacant positions are posted, and trainings re underway for the new staff. However, the vacancies still present challenges, and staff work with each other to fill the gaps. Technical Assistance: There was a three-day national training course around technical assistance. VR, O&M, and Catholic Charities were in attendance for a full day, which covered all the basics of pre-employment transition services.	NONE	NONE

BEP ⁶ Update: The Commissioner has asked for a BEP Strategic plan and they are in discussions now to bring in a national facilitator to work out this strategy.
